

## **TOWN PARKS**

Sherrillbrook Town Park, Rt. 12, Donovan Town Park on Elm Street in Chadwicks, and Washington Mills Athletic Park on Oneida Street. Open 7 days a week, May 1st - August 31<sup>st</sup>, 8 a.m. - 8:30 p.m. & September 1<sup>st</sup> - October 31<sup>st</sup> 8 a.m. - 7:30 p.m.

## **PICNIC FACILITIES**

The Town provides picnic facilities at Donovan Park in Chadwicks, Sherrillbrook Park, and Washington Mills Athletic Park. Chadwicks has two shelters with several tables and grills; rest rooms are available. Sherrillbrook has several tables and grills, along with four shelters; rest rooms available. Washington Mills Athletic Park has one shelter with rest rooms available.

## **RESERVATIONS**

Reservations for Sherrillbrook, Donovan and Washington Mills Athletic Park can be made by stopping in the office located in Sherrillbrook Park and obtaining a permit and paying the proper fees. The large pavilions at Donovan and Sherrillbrook Park are \$40 for residents and \$80 for non-residents. All other pavilions are \$20 for residents and \$40 dollars for non-residents. Gazebo weddings are \$20 for residents and \$40 for non-residents. Groups of twenty-five or more must have a permit to make use of the park facilities. Reservations cannot be made by phone. Office hours are 7:00 a.m. – noon & 12:30 - 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. For more information call Maureen Owens at 724-0654. Resident fees give New Hartford residents half off on all pavilion and gazebo rentals. Must provide driver's license for proof of residency.

## **TENNIS FACILITIES**

The Town offers two courts each at Donovan Park and Sherrillbrook Park, and two more courts are available adjacent to the Recreation Center parking lot.

## **PLAYGROUND APPARATUS**

The Town has modular play systems at Donovan Park, Sherrillbrook Park, behind the New Hartford Recreation Center, and at the Washington Mills Athletic Park.

## **MOUNTAIN BIKING POLICY**

In an effort to protect Sherrillbrook Parks hiking and ski trail system, while trying to allow for limited use of specific trails for mountain bike activities, the Town of New Hartford Parks & Recreation Department has adopted a municipal law which restricts mountain bike riders to the trail A section of the parks hiking and ski trail system, and any paved roadways within the park. Biking enthusiasts who are operating their bikes on any lawn areas of the park or on trails other than the trail A section of the park will be subject to a fine and removal from the park.
